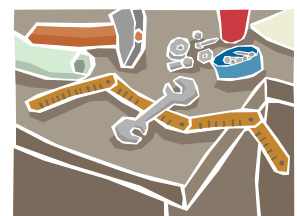

**ball catch** (n) - latch which uses spring pressure to force a ball bearing into a recess in its strike

**multi-point lock** (n) - a lock which has one than more bolt which are thrown and withdrawn simultaneously, often in more than one direction

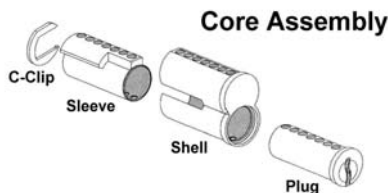

**IC CORNER—WILLIAM M. LYNK, CRL**

Most small format cores come with four basic components: The plug, sleeve, shell and a c-clip (or bradded-on back plate) to secure the plug into the Core Assembly.

With the advent of a variety of SFIC manufacturer variations, the sleeve which contains the control lug may be a saddle-type. Both Arrow and Sargent have “modular” cores, and new designs are still being developed.

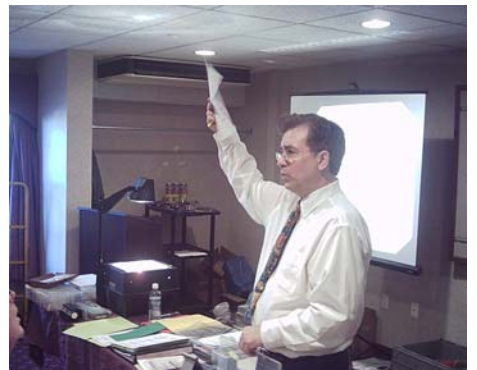
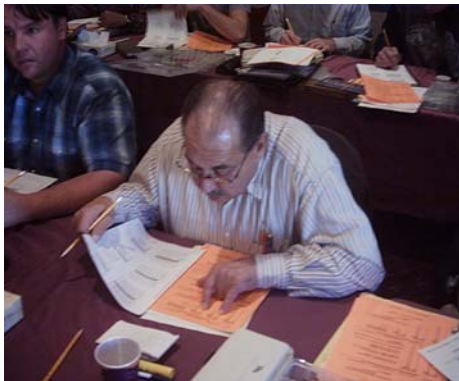
